#Monday Cricket Fact – The Daffodils who play in white - Llanidloes Cricket Club

In September 2012 Glamorgan CC confirmed that the daffodil would be re- introduced as the club’s official logo, however the daffodil is also shared as it club logo. #Monday Fact- Daffodils are true heralds of spring. Despite a recent population decline, they are still one of the most common wildflowers of the Welsh countryside. Daffodils are grown commercially in Mid Wales to produce galantamine for the treatment of Alzheimer’s disease. As a National symbol, they were introduced during the 19th century, as a replacement for the humble leek. David Lloyd George, the only Welshman to serve as Prime Minister, was a public advocate of the Narcissus (its Latin name) and its appearance in early spring acts as a symbol of nature’s optimism and neatly coincides with St David’s Day on March 1.

View from #Bish... St. David’s Day, the national day of Wales has been celebrated as such since the 12th Century. Today these celebrations usually involve the singing of traditional songs and the wearing of the national costume with leeks and/or daffodils being worn as the national symbols of Wales.
