Believe it or not, there was once no money. It seems we are going full circle in life as well as sport. Coins have been around longer than you might think and they have always carried a bit of history or a message. The oldest coin we have is the ‘Lydian Lion’ – so called because it was minted in Lydia and has a lion on it. Made of electrum, a naturally occurring alloy of gold and silver, it was minted in 600 BC. There was a similar development of coinage in China about the same time.

On British coins, we have had some interesting images and words, for example, the welsh words, “**Pleidol wyf I’m gwlad**”. Also, a few British coins have some clear Christian references. Domine Dirige Nos is Latin for “Lord, guide us” and Nisi Dominus Frustra means “In vain without the Lord”. Of course, Nemo Me Impune Lacessit (“No one will attack me with impunity”) a bit more confrontational.

Britannia, the female character who represents the ‘spirit of Britain’, has appeared on coins in the UK since the days of Emperor Hadrian. In more recent times, she has gone from standing on a two-bob bit to sitting on a 50p. She has also gained an olive branch of peace which is held out, while the trident is now behind her. The imagery has gone from warlike to peace loving. Enjoy checking the faces on your cash & coins in the next few weeks! While you still can.
