#The Essential News Story - Boot gets the... er boot, from Monopoly Penguin, dinosaur and duck replace some old favourites

The World's most popular board game, Monopoly, is to update some of its playing 'counters' used in the classic version.



Conceived in America in 1903 and now owned by toymakers Hasbro .Monopoly will say goodbye to the thimble and wheelbarrow as well as the boot. In will come a rubber duck, T-Rex and a penguin. This is in addition to the cat, which replaced the iron in 2013. This has all come about as part of a campaign to update the game based, to some degree, on votes by consumers during a promotional period earlier this year. The new version of the game will be released in August. Fans of the traditional 'cast' of Monopoly needn't totally despair, four classic pieces have survived the voting: the Car, Scottie dog, Battleship and Top Hat, some of which date as far back as the Great Depression. The version of the game most people recognise was first published by Parker Brothers in 1935. Monopoly was devised 'to demonstrate that an economy which rewards wealth creation which is better than one in which monopolists work under few constraints'.
